TREADLE PLIMP: \$200

Drought (rhymes with "out") is a long period of dry weather with no rain or very little rain. Streams can dry up and crops can die. If this happens year after year, people have no way to water their crops. They may run out of food and even starve.

Treadle pumps are used in parts of Africa and Asia where there are droughts. Watering a garden is as easy as riding a bike! The water is pumped from the ground or a stream using a standing pedal pump. It is pumped through a hose to water the crops.

GOD'S KINGDOM S LIKE A S E E E D Mark 4:26-32

Characters: Andrew, Jesus, James, John, Peter

- Andrew: Jesus, you talk a lot about the kingdom of God. Will there be a castle and king? Can I be a prince?
 - Jesus: No castles! The kingdom of God is more like a farmer scattering seed on the ground. The farmer sleeps and eats for many days. The seed sprouts and grows. The farmer doesn't understand how it happens, but it does. The stalk appears, the head, and then the full grain. The scattered seeds become an entire field full of grain. The farmer gathers in all that grain.
 - James: If I had that much grain, I would make food for my family.
 - John: I would store some to eat later.
 - **Peter:** I would keep some to plant next year.
 - James: I would give some to my neighbors.
 - John: Come to think of it, I would have a big party and invite everyone I know. It sounds like it was a big crop.

- Andrew: I still don't understand this kingdom of God.
 - Jesus: Okay. Here's another story. The kingdom of God is like a tiny mustard seed. When it's planted, the mustard seed grows and grows until it has large branches. Birds come and build their nests in the safety of the branches. Does that help?
 - **Peter:** I think I've got it. God's kingdom starts out small, and it doesn't look like much of anything will come from it.
- James: But then God's kingdom grows and grows until it becomes like that huge field of grain.
 - John: We don't know quite how it happens, but it does. It gets bigger and bigger.
- Andrew: I know that people aren't birds. But it sounds like maybe God's kingdom is a safe place where people can make a real home—like those birds building their nests in the mustard bush.

Jesus: You have some good ideas! I have a lot of other kingdom stories to tell you. I'll tell them on our way to lunch. Let's go!

A HARVEST OF GOODNESS

Read about people whose kindness spread and grew

Jeremiah Mussmon, from Purcellville, Virginia, found out that some people didn't have shoes. He asked others at his school to help. They brought enough shoes to line the halls of the entire school. Jeremiah and his family traveled to Haiti to deliver the shoes. They measured kids' feet, washed their feet, then gave each one a pair of shoes.

Janeece Edroff of Vancouver, British Columbia, has a condition that causes tumors to grow on nerve pathways in her body. She has had many surgeries. Over the years, she has done many projects to raise money to help children with disabilities. She has sold hot dogs and asked people to give coins. Now other kids have begun to do fundraisers because of Janeece's example. Maria Keller, from Orono, Minnesota, loved to read. When she was 8 years old she found out that not everyone had books, so she decided to do something about it. Maria did book drives asking people to donate books. She gave the books to hospitals and schools around the world. She gave away a million books by age 13.

Roberto Clemente was a professional baseball player from Puerto Rico. He was a great player for the Pittsburgh Pirates, he is remembered best for sowing kindness. His Catholic faith was very important to him and during the off season, he helped people in need. He died in a plane crash in 1972 when he was delivering emergency relief to earthquake victims in Nicaragua.

Family Psalm

Work together to write your own psalm of praise for the things your family loves about creation. You could pattern it after Psalm 104 or come up with your own style, such as rhyming poetry. You could set it to the tune of a simple song or try speak it in a certain rhythm. Include favorite animals, plants, and people. Creation Care Challenges!



ENJOY: Play an animal sounds memory game. The leader starts a sequence of animal sounds (*moo*, *baa*, *oink*). The rest of the family repeats it. The leader repeats the sequence, adding one more sound (*moo*, *baa*, *oink*, *baa*). Continue adding sounds (*moo*, *baa*, *oink*, *baa*, *chirp*) until the other players can't remember the sequence anymore. *Tip:* If you have small animal toys, line them up in the correct order for younger players as a reminder of the sequence.

LEARN: Explore the Nat Geo Wild website and YouTube channel to learn about animals you're interested in. Read *One Small Square: Backyard* by Donald M. Silver and *The Water Hole* by Graeme Base (read-aloud available on YouTube).

PRAY: Creator God, thank you for an amazing world filled with animals, plants, and people. Each one is made in a special way. There are many animals at risk of extinction, and many pets that are not properly cared for. Some animals are not able to find food or water. Please protect the animals and show us how we can take care of them. Amen.

Creation Care Challenges!

HEAL: Read books or search online to learn about the habitats (homes) of various animals. What habitats are at risk for being destroyed? Donate to an organization that is helping to protect animal habitats. Or look for ways to protect the animals in your neighborhood— pick up trash, keep food and trash secure so animals can't access it, and avoid using pesticides.

ENJOY: Explore bird songs from around the world. Choose birds to listen to on the www.xeno-canto.org website. The site includes maps of where each bird lives. The map will be at the top; scroll down and click on the arrow(s) on the left to play the sounds.

LEARN: Psalm 104 talks about nocturnal animals. Learn about animals that are awake at night, such as raccoons, bats, hedgehogs, cougars, owls, foxes, and badgers.

PRAY: God, you made the bright sun that warms us and the green trees that shade us. You made amazing animals and birds. We praise you for your amazing creation. Help us take care of the beautiful world you made. Amen.

Today at VBS, we heard two stories that Jesus told. He said that God's kingdom is like a tiny growing seed. It starts small but becomes like a great harvest or a large shade tree. ENJOY: Plant seeds in a pot or a sunny garden space. Take good care of your seeds by providing good soil, watering them, and making sure they get plenty of sunlight!

LEARN: Search online to discover how many churches there are in your city or neighborhood. How many did you find? ______ Explore the website for your church or another church near you to find out its history. Say a prayer for the churches and the important work they do to grow God's kingdom.

PRAY: God, your kingdom starts small, like a tiny seed. We can plant tiny seeds of love, peace, and kindness when we are at home, at work, at school, and at play. Thank you that we are part of your growing kingdom. Amen.



Creation Care Challenges!

HEAL: Save a tree! Use paper wisely: reuse it, use scrap paper, and use cloth napkins. Borrow, share, and donate books. Recycle paper and cardboard so it can be used again in other paper products. Don't forget those empty toilet paper rolls!

ENJOY: Make "tree people" using leaves for the body and head and twigs for arms and legs.

LEARN: What kinds of trees grow in your neighborhood? Take a walk with your family, and try to identify the trees that are within walking distance of your home. (Search online to find a leaf identification guide.) List them here:

> Did You Know? The mustard tree is also called the "toothbrush tree." Just peel the bark off a stick and chew! It has been used for hundreds of years as a natural toothbrush, and it's even recommended by the World Health Organization. The leaves can be eaten in a salad and used for medicine.

Start

Play with a partner or a group. Each player uses his or her own game board from this booklet. Begin by placing a button, stone, or bean on each fruit. Find a game marker and place it on Start. One player at a time rolls the die and must move in the specified way or lose a turn:

Even number: move up, left, or right **Odd number:** move down, left, or right

Once you reach a fruit, move the button, stone, or bean to the base of the tree. The first person to move all the fruit back to the base is the winner.

CREATION CARE CHALLENGES FOR YOUR FAMILY!

Thanks for floating around with me this week! I've been talking a lot about water. It is one of the earth's most precious resources, and we all need it. My friends and I came up with a list of things your family can do to save water. We hope you'll try some of our ideas! And remember—have fun in God's Great Big Beautiful World! I'll "sea" you around!

Make sure the faucets are turned off. (One drip / second = 5 gal / day or 21 L / day!) Turn off the water while brushing your teeth. (Saves 4 gal/minute or 15 L / minute!) Wash fruits and vegetables in a bowl of water instead of under running tap water. Then, use the water in the bowl for your houseplants or garden. Take 5-minute showers instead of a bath. A full bath can use up to 70 gal / 265 L of water. You can save 1,000 gal / 3,875 L per month just by taking shorter showers!

Run the dishwasher and washing machine only when they ^{are} full.

Have a fish? When cleaning out the tank, use the water from the tank to water your houseplants.

Drop an ice cube? Don't put it in the sink. Place it in the dirt of a houseplant. Get no shower? P in the sho the extra w it to wate pour the pitcher with and use it

Waiting for the water to get hot for your shower? Place a bucket in the shower to catch the extra water and use it to water plants. Or pour the water plants. Or pour the water into a pitcher with a water filter and use it for cooking or drinking.
