





Creation Care Challenges!



HEAL: If you don't already have one, put a recycling bin in your kitchen or garage. Collect recyclable materials, such as plastic, aluminum, metal cans, and paper.



LEARN: Psalm 104 talks about nocturnal animals. Learn about animals that are awake at night, such as raccoons, bats, hedgehogs, cougars, owls, foxes, and badgers.

PRAY: God, you made the bright sun that warms us and the green trees that shade us. You made amazing animals and birds. We praise you for your amazing creation. Help us take care of the beautiful world you made. Amen.

Creation Care Challenges!







HEAL: Show that you care about animals. Get a bird feeder, walk a dog, visit a zoo or animal shelter, or donate to an organization that protects endangered species.

ENJOY: Play an animal sounds memory game. The leader starts a sequence of animal sounds (*moo*, *baa*, *oink*). The rest of the family repeats it. The leader repeats the sequence, adding one sound (*moo*, *baa*, *oink*, *baa*). Continue adding sounds (*moo*, *baa*, *oink*, *baa*, *chirp*) until the family can't remember the sequence anymore. *Tip:* If you have animal toys, line them up in the correct order as a reminder of the sequence.

LEARN: Read books or watch online videos about your favorite animals and plants.

PRAY: Creator God, thank you for an amazing world filled with animals, plants, and people. Show us how to take care of your world. Amen.

Creation Care Challenges!



HEAL: Save a tree! Use paper wisely: reuse it, use scrap paper, and use cloth napkins. Borrow, share, and donate books. Recycle paper and cardboard. Turn a box into a pretend car. Climb in and take a ride! Repurpose an empty tissue box to hold small toys.



ENJOY: Go for a tree walk. Count how many trees are within walking distance of your home. How are the trees similar and different?

LEARN: Look at online pictures of the trees named in today's Bible passages: cedars of Lebanon, date palm trees, and olive trees.

PRAY: God, thank you for all the different kinds of trees you created. We are like trees, growing strong and trusting you to care for us. Amen.

Creation Care Challenges!



HEAL: The mustard seed in Jesus' parable grew up to be a safe place for birds to nest. Invite a family to eat a meal with you. You help God's kingdom grow when you welcome others.



ENJOY: Plant seeds in a pot or a sunny garden space. Take good care of your seeds by providing good soil, watering them, and making sure they get plenty of sunlight!

LEARN: Watch YouTube videos of growing seeds. Search for "Lima Bean Time Lapse" and "Bean Time-Lapse - 25 Days."

PRAY: God, your kingdom starts small, like a tiny seed. We can plant tiny seeds of love, peace, and kindness wherever we go. Thank you that we are part of your growing kingdom. Amen.

CREATION CARE CHALLENGES FOR YOUR FAMILY!

I am challenging your family to HELP care for creation! That means to *Heal* parts of the earth that are hurt or broken, *Enjoy* the natural world, Learn about creation, and *Pray* for the world. *Choose* one or more of the HELP ideas to complete as a family.



HEAL: Save water! Wash fruits and vegetables in a bowl of water instead of under running tap water. Then use the water in the bowl for your houseplants or garden. Turn off the water while brushing your teeth. This saves 4 gal / minute or 15 L / minute! Take short showers instead of a bath. A full bath can use up to 70 gal / 265 L of water.



ENJOY: Take a watering can and go for a "water walk" together. Look for plants and trees that could use some water. Carefully pour water on each one. Talk about the challenges that some people in the world face just to get clean water.



LEARN: Find out your family's water footprint! Search online for "Water Footprint Calculator" by Grace Communications Foundation to see how much water your family uses. Visit www.wateruseitwisely.com for lots of tips on saving water.

PRAY: Thank you, God, for the rivers, lakes, and oceans all over the world. Help us to use water with care. Be with those who do not have clean water. Show us how we can help. Amen.
